
U.S. and New Hampshire Unemployment Rates, Seasonally Adjusted








Unemployment Rates by State






















2023 Q3* Average Weekly Wage, Total, Private Employers Plus Government For workers covered by unemployment insurance

















Programs with the highest number of Bachelor's Degrees awarded by New Hampshire colleges and universities between July 1, 2021, and June 30, 2022










